

ILAC Meeting - 16 March 2022

Summary & Actions

Key highlights:

- ILAC approved the Relationship Agreement with Council and its 2022 Work Programme, noting the Council also approved these documents at its 14 March Council meeting.
- Council has appointed international learner Cecily Zhou to the Interim Learner Advisory Committee.
- Hamish Duncan and Skyla Flowers were confirmed as the recommended ILAC representatives on te Poari Akoranga.
- Jordan Gush was re-appointed as ILAC Council representative.

General discussion points to note:

1) Learner Engagement Framework

- How does learner engagement happen in your institutions? Do you have some examples of good engagement that you can share?

2) Learner Leader Videos

Aroha Treacher from Treacherous Media provided an overview of the project she is collaborating on with Te Pūkenga Communications Team. Aroha asked members if they would be interested in being filmed about their learner journey experiences. It was noted that she would be in further contact with those that had indicated interest in being part of the project.

3) Learner Voice

Committee members discussed the importance of ensuring the learner voice was being sought and heard by the Council on significant strategic matters.
